



Summer Ponchette

Originally designed by Alicia Paulson and adapted by Gena Hester

Crochet, intermediate

Sized for Small/Medium and Large/Extra Large. Shown in Small/Medium



Shown in Beadnik-MD (103 yds) 2 skeins (Blue Beat)(3 skeins of Beadnik if you make the larger size (#4) worsted weight



Also shown in Wiggles-TLC (250 yds) 1 skein (Yellow) or 2 skeins for larger size.



Any worsted weight smooth yarn will substitute – about 200 yds for smaller size, 300 yds for larger size.

“K”(10.5) (6.5mm) Hook or size to obtain gauge

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS:

Lower edge circumference 60" (72")

Length 12" (15")

GAUGE:

5 sts and 10 rnds to 4" over dc with size K/10.5 hook (6.5mm)

TAKE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE PLEASE!

PONCHETTE:

Ch 60 (72). Keeping sts untwisted, join with sl st in 1st ch to form ring.

Yoke:

Rnd 1: (5 dc in next ch, sk next ch, sl st in next ch, sk next ch) 15 (18) times – 15 (18) scallops.

Rnd 2: Ch 6 (counts as dc, ch3), sk next 2 dc, sc in next dc, ch3, sk next 2 dc, dc in next st. (Ch 3, sk next 2 dc, sc in next dc, ch 3, sk next 2 dc, dc in next st) 14 (17) times, Join with sl st to 3rd ch of first ch-6.

Rnd 3: (5 tr in next sc, sl st in next dc) around, ending last rep with sl st in same sc as first scallop – 15 (18) scallops.

Center Section:

Rnd. 1: (Ch 6, sk next 2 tr, sl st in next tr, ch 6, sk next 2 tr, sl st in next st) 15 (18) times – 30 (36) loops.

Rnd. 2: Sl st in next 4 ch; (ch 6, sl st in next ch-6 sp) around. Join with sl st in st at base of first ch-6.

Rep. rnd 2 for 8 (12) times more.

Trim:

Rnd 1: (Sk next 2 ch, 5 dc in next ch, sk next 2 ch, sl st in next st) 30 (36) times--30 (36 scallops). Fasten off.

Rnd 2: Rep rnd 2 of yoke around.

Rnd 3: Rep rnd 3 of yoke around – 30 (36 scallops). Stop here if you would like the "scallop" edge.

Optional: Rnd 4: Rep rnd 2 of yoke around if you would like a softer edge.

Options Neck Edging:

On the “Wiggles” ponchette, I added this edging because the little “tails” fell over the edge of the neck nicely. Attach yarn at neck into the back loop of your beginning ch (working around neck on these BACK chains), ch 1, sc into 1st st, (ch 1, sc in next st, ch 1, sc in same st), repeat around – this creates a small “picot” around neck edge, sl st to join at beginning, tie off.

On the “Wiggles” Ponchette, I found I needed to block flat, but the “Beadnik” flattened on its own – enjoy!
